A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Baltimore City – West North Avenue Development Authority

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the West North Avenue Development Authority in 4 Baltimore City; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Authority; $\mathbf{5}$ prohibiting a member of the Authority from receiving certain compensation, but 6 authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Authority to 7 support and develop a certain neighborhood revitalization plan in coordination with 8 certain residents; requiring the Authority to report its findings and 9 recommendations to the Governor and to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; defining certain terms; providing for the 10 11 termination of this Act; and generally relating to the West North Avenue 12**Development** Authority.

3 (B) "BUFFER ZONE" MEANS THE AREA WITHIN 250 YARDS OF THE TARGET 4 AREA.

5 (C) "TARGET AREA" MEANS THE PORTION OF WEST NORTH AVENUE IN 6 BALTIMORE CITY BETWEEN THE 600 BLOCK AND THE 3200 BLOCK, INCLUSIVE.

11 (A) THE AUTHORITY CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:

12 (1) ONE MEMBER OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND WHO REPRESENTS 13 THE TARGET AREA, APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;

14(2)ONE MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES WHO REPRESENTS15THE TARGET AREA, APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE;

16 (3) THE SECRETARY OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, 17 OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

18 (4) THE SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION, OR THE SECRETARY'S 19 DESIGNEE;

20 (5) ONE MEMBER OF THE BALTIMORE CITY COUNCIL WHO 21 REPRESENTS THE TARGET AREA, APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE 22 BALTIMORE CITY COUNCIL;

- 23 (6) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE MAYOR OF BALTIMORE CITY;
- 24 (7) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR;

25 (8) THE DIRECTOR OF THE BALTIMORE DEVELOPMENT 26 CORPORATION, OR THE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE;

27(9)THE COMMISSIONER OF THE BALTIMORE CITY DEPARTMENT OF28HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, OR THE COMMISSIONER'S DESIGNEE;

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1 (10) THE DIRECTOR OF THE BALTIMORE CITY DEPARTMENT OF 2 TRANSPORTATION, OR THE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE;

3 (11) THE DIRECTOR OF THE BALTIMORE CITY DEPARTMENT OF 4 PLANNING, OR THE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE;

5 (12) THE PRESIDENT OF COPPIN STATE UNIVERSITY, OR THE 6 PRESIDENT'S DESIGNEE; AND

7 (13) THE PRESIDENT OF THE MARYLAND INSTITUTE COLLEGE OF 8 ART, OR THE PRESIDENT'S DESIGNEE.

9 (B) A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS SHALL ELECT EITHER THE MEMBER 10 DESCRIBED UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(12) OR (13) OF THIS SECTION TO BE THE CHAIR 11 OF THE AUTHORITY.

12 **12–704.**

13(A) THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, IN COORDINATION WITH THE14AUTHORITY, SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE AUTHORITY.

15 **(B)** THE AUTHORITY MAY RECEIVE DONATED SERVICES FROM 16 ACCOUNTANTS, LAWYERS, OR OTHER CONSULTANTS AS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT 17 THIS SUBTITLE.

18 (C) THE AUTHORITY MAY SUPERVISE, MANAGE, AND TERMINATE STAFF 19 AND CONSULTANTS AS NECESSARY.

20 **12–705.**

21 **A MEMBER OF THE AUTHORITY:**

22 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE 23 AUTHORITY; BUT

24 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE 25 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

27 (A) THE AUTHORITY SHALL:

1(1) SUPPORT THE DEVELOPMENT AND APPROVAL OF A2COMPREHENSIVE NEIGHBORHOOD REVITALIZATION PLAN IN THE TARGET AREA3AND THE BUFFER ZONE TO BENEFIT:

- (I) THE RESIDENTS;
- 5 (II) HOUSING;
- 6 (III) NEIGHBORHOODS;
- 7 (IV) ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT; AND

8 (V) TRANSPORTATION, INCLUDING MOTOR VEHICLES AND 9 PEDESTRIANS; AND

10(2)WORK IN COORDINATION WITH THE RESIDENTS OF THE TARGET11AREA AND THE BUFFER ZONE TO DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE NEIGHBORHOOD12REVITALIZATION PLAN.

ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2023, THE AUTHORITY SHALL REPORT ITS 13**(B)** 14COMPREHENSIVE NEIGHBORHOOD REVITALIZATION STRATEGY TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO 15**TAXATION COMMITTEE** SENATE BUDGET AND AND THE HOUSE 16 THE 17**APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE.**

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 19 October 1, 2021. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of September 20 30, 2026, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be 21 abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
