A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing – Responsibilities**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the responsibilities of the Office of the Deaf and Hard of
4 Hearing; altering the name and the membership of the Maryland Advisory
5 Council for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing; defining a certain term; and
6 generally relating to the Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing and the
7 Maryland Advisory Council for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
9 Article – State Government
10 Section 9–2401, 9–2403, and 9–2404
11 Annotated Code of Maryland
12 (2009 Replacement Volume)

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – State Government**

16 9–2401.

17 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

18 (b) “Council” means the Maryland Advisory Council [for] ON Deaf and Hard
19 of Hearing Individuals.

20 (c) (1) “Deaf and hard of hearing individuals” means those residents of
21 Maryland who have a partial or complete loss of hearing.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 (2) “Deaf and hard of hearing individuals” includes **INDIVIDUALS**
2 **WHO ARE** [the] deaf, [the] hard of hearing, **DEAFBLIND**, and [the] late–deafened.

3 **(3) “DEAFBLIND” MEANS THOSE RESIDENTS OF MARYLAND WHO**
4 **HAVE CONCOMITANT VISION AND HEARING LOSS.**

5 (d) “Director” means the Director of the Office.

6 (e) “Office” means the Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing.

7 9–2403.

8 (a) The Office shall be responsible for promoting the general welfare of deaf
9 and hard of hearing individuals in the State.

10 (b) The responsibilities of the Office shall include:

11 (1) providing, advocating, and coordinating the adoption of public
12 policies, regulations, and programs that will benefit deaf and hard of hearing
13 individuals;

14 (2) improving access to communication and to existing services and
15 programs for deaf and hard of hearing individuals;

16 (3) providing direct services to deaf and hard of hearing individuals as
17 appropriate;

18 (4) increasing public awareness of the needs and issues affecting deaf
19 and hard of hearing individuals;

20 (5) working with State and local agencies to ensure access for deaf and
21 hard of hearing individuals to safety and emergency services[, including the
22 acquisition and distribution of visual smoke detectors];

23 (6) developing a referral service for deaf and hard of hearing
24 individuals;

25 (7) serving as an information clearinghouse on the needs and issues
26 affecting deaf and hard of hearing individuals;

27 (8) working to increase access for deaf and hard of hearing individuals
28 to educational, health, and social opportunities;

29 (9) working with private organizations, the federal government, and
30 other units of State government to promote economic development for deaf and hard of
31 hearing individuals;

1 (10) working to eliminate the underemployment and unemployment of
2 deaf and hard of hearing individuals;

3 (11) providing a network through which services provided by State and
4 federal programs serving deaf and hard of hearing individuals can be channeled; and

5 (12) promoting compliance with State, local, and federal laws and
6 policies protecting and serving deaf and hard of hearing individuals.

7 (c) The Office shall hold at least two public town hall meetings each year to
8 receive public comments on:

9 (1) the quality of State services and programs affecting deaf and hard
10 of hearing individuals;

11 (2) the functions and operations of the Office; and

12 (3) any other issues that affect deaf and hard of hearing individuals,
13 including those specified in subsection (b) of this section.

14 (d) The Office shall:

15 (1) help facilitate the appropriate delivery of State, local, and other
16 public services to deaf and hard of hearing individuals;

17 (2) advise other units of State government and the General Assembly
18 on the needs of deaf and hard of hearing individuals;

19 (3) subject to appropriations in the State budget, provide any
20 reasonable resources that any other unit of State government requests to serve or
21 assist deaf and hard of hearing individuals; and

22 (4) to the greatest extent possible, in order to avoid any duplication of
23 effort, coordinate with other units of the State and the federal government the services
24 provided to deaf and hard of hearing individuals.

26 (a) There is a Maryland Advisory Council [for] **ON** the Deaf and Hard of
27 Hearing.

28 (b) (1) The Council consists of [16] **18** members appointed by the
29 Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate.

30 (2) Of the [16] **18** Council members, at least five of the members shall
31 be deaf and hard of hearing individuals.

1 (c) Of the [16] 18 Council members:

2 (1) one shall be the State Superintendent or a designee from the State
3 Department of Education;

4 (2) one shall be the Secretary or a designee from the Department of
5 Health and Mental Hygiene;

6 (3) one shall be the Secretary or a designee from the Department of
7 Human Resources;

8 (4) one shall be the Secretary or a designee from the Department of
9 Transportation;

10 (5) one shall be from the Human Relations Commission;

11 (6) one shall be the Secretary or a designee from the Department of
12 Labor, Licensing, and Regulation;

13 (7) one shall be the Secretary or a designee from the Department of
14 Housing and Community Development;

15 (8) one shall be the Superintendent or a designee from the Maryland
16 School for the Deaf; [and]

17 **(9) ONE SHALL BE THE SECRETARY OR A DESIGNEE FROM THE**
18 **DEPARTMENT OF AGING; AND**

19 **[(9)] (10) [eight] NINE** shall be from the general public.

20 (d) (1) The **[eight] NINE** members from the general public shall be chosen
21 from different geographical areas of the State.

22 (2) Of the **[eight] NINE** members from the general public:

23 (i) five shall be deaf and hard of hearing individuals;

24 (ii) one shall be a private citizen with special knowledge or
25 expertise relating to services to deaf and hard of hearing individuals;

26 (iii) one shall be a parent of a deaf or hard of hearing child; [and]

27 (iv) one shall be from a private agency providing services to deaf
28 and hard of hearing individuals; **AND**

29 **(V) ONE SHALL BE A PERSON WITH SPECIAL KNOWLEDGE**
30 **OR EXPERTISE RELATING TO SERVICES TO INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE DEAFBLIND.**

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
2 October 1, 2010.
