1 AN ACT concerning

<u> Maryland State Song – Repeal and Replace – State Selection Panel</u> <u>General Provisions – Historical State Song</u>

4 FOR the purpose of repealing altering the State song to be the historical State song; establishing the State Song Selection Panel; providing for the composition, chair, and $\mathbf{5}$ 6 staffing of the Panel; prohibiting a member of the Panel from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the 7 8 Panel to develop a plan for and conduct a certain State song competition, including 9 an online voting platform, and to carry out certain tasks relating to the competition; 10 authorizing the Panel to solicit certain private contributions for a certain prize fund; requiring the Panel to report the winner of the State song competition to the 11 Governor and the General Assembly and to recommend certain legislation on or 12 before a certain date: providing for the termination of certain provisions of this Act; 13and generally relating to the historical State song. 14

Preamble

1 WHEREAS, In 1939, the poem "Maryland! My Maryland!", written by James Ryder 2 Randall in the early days of the Civil War, was set to the tune of "Lauriger Horatius" and 3 adopted as the official State song; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Randall, who had left Maryland to live in the Confederate states,
wrote "Maryland! My Maryland!" to express his outrage at the news of Union troops being
marched through Baltimore and to promote secession in Maryland; and

7 WHEREAS, The words of Mr. Randall's poem, which advocate the overthrow of the 8 United States government and disparage Northerners and President Abraham Lincoln, are 9 controversial, inappropriate, and do not represent the ideals and values of Marylanders 10 today; and

WHEREAS, The State of Maryland represents the values of inclusivity and equality;and

13WHEREAS, As determined in the 2015 State Song Commission Report, an official14song should celebrate the best in Maryland and its citizens, be unique to Maryland, be15memorable, popular, singable, short, and historically significant, and be inclusive of all

16 Marylanders; and

WHEREAS, It is imperative that the current State song be retired and that a new
State song be adopted that honors the past, celebrates the present, and anticipates the
bright future of this State and its residents; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

31	General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
