#### 1 AN ACT concerning

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### Maryland Intrastate Emergency Management Assistance Compact

- 3 FOR the purpose of renaming the Maryland Emergency Management Assistance Compact 4 to be the Maryland Intrastate Emergency Management Assistance Compact; 5 altering the purpose of the Compact; requiring a certain official to designate more 6 than one authorized representative for a certain purpose; altering the information 7 that must be provided by a certain written request; repealing the authority of a 8 certain official to advise the Maryland Emergency Management Agency of certain 9 requests and provide copies of certain requests; altering the circumstances under 10 which certain provisions of law take effect and continue in effect; altering certain definitions; making stylistic changes; and generally relating to the Maryland 11 Intrastate Emergency Management Assistance Compact. 12

#### 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:



- 1 Article - Public Safety 2 Subtitle 8. Maryland INTRASTATE Emergency Management Assistance Compact. 14-801. 3 4 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. "Authorized representative" means an employee of a local jurisdiction 5 (b) authorized by the senior elected official of that jurisdiction to request, offer, or provide 6 assistance under the terms of the [compact] COMPACT. 7 8 "Compact" means the Maryland INTRASTATE Emergency Management 9 Assistance Compact. 10 (d) "Emergency responder" means an individual who is sent or directed by (1) 11 a party jurisdiction in response to a request for assistance by another party jurisdiction. 12 (2)"Emergency responder" includes a: 13 (i) career or volunteer firefighter [within this State] OF A FIRE, 14 RESCUE, OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ENTITY; 15 career or volunteer emergency medical services provider, as (ii) defined in § 13–516 of the Education Article, within this State; 16 17 career or volunteer rescue squad member [within this State] OF A FIRE, RESCUE, OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ENTITY: 18 19 (iv) county OR MUNICIPAL employee who is performing an emergency support function described in § [14–803(2)(b)(5)(ii)] **14–803(2)(B)(5)(I)** of this 20 21 subtitle: and 22law enforcement officer as defined in § 3–101 of this article. (v) 23"Jurisdictions" means the 23 counties within Maryland, Baltimore City, the City of Annapolis, and Ocean City. 24"PARTY JURISDICTION" MEANS A JURISDICTION THAT ENACTS THE 2526COMPACT IN A FORM SUBSTANTIALLY SIMILAR TO THE COMPACT SET FORTH IN 27 THIS SUBTITLE.

11 12 13	(a) (1) The purpose of this Compact is to provide for <b>EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT</b> mutual assistance between the jurisdictions entering into this Compact [in managing an emergency].					
14 15 16 17	(2) This Compact also shall provide for mutual cooperation in [emergency-related] EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT-RELATED exercises, testing, or other training activities [using equipment or personnel simulating performance of any aspect of the giving and receiving of aid by party jurisdictions during emergencies].

19 20 21 22	(b) (1) The senior elected official of each jurisdiction shall designate [an] authorized [representative] REPRESENTATIVES. [The] AN authorized representative of a party jurisdiction may request assistance [of] FROM another party jurisdiction by contacting [the] AN authorized representative of that jurisdiction.					
23 24	(2) The provisions of this Compact shall apply only to requests for assistance made by and to authorized representatives.					
25	(3) Requests may be verbal or in writing.					
26 27	(4) If verbal, the request shall be confirmed in writing at the earliest possible date, but no later than 10 calendar days following the verbal request.					
28	(5) Written requests shall provide the following information:					
29 30	(i) [A description of the emergency support function for which assistance is needed;					

- 1 (ii) The emergency support function shall include, but not be 2 limited to, THE FUNCTIONAL AREAS FOR WHICH ASSISTANCE IS NEEDED, INCLUDING 3 services. enforcement. medical services. transportation. law emergency communications, public works and engineering, building inspection, planning and 4 information assistance, mass care, resource support, health and medical services, and 5 6 search and rescue: 7 (iii) The amount and type of personnel, equipment, materials, and supplies needed and a reasonable estimate of the length of time they will be needed: 8 9 and 10 (iv) The specific place and time for staging of the assisting party's response and a point of contact at that location. 11 12 THE MISSION, CAPABILITY, SIZE, AND AMOUNT OF (II) 13 THE REQUESTED AID; AND 14 (III) THE LOGISTICS, LOCATION, AND TIME FOR STAGING 15 THE AID FROM A RESPONDING PARTY JURISDICTION. 16 There shall be frequent consultations between the Maryland Emergency Management Agency and appropriate representatives of the party jurisdictions 17 18 with [free] THE UNHINDERED exchange of information and plans generally relating to 19 emergency [capabilities] MANAGEMENT. 20 (7)[A senior elected official or an] AN authorized representative OF THE REQUESTING PARTY JURISDICTION will advise the Maryland Emergency 2122 Management Agency of verbal requests and provide copies of written requests. 23 Article 3. Limitations. (3) 24(c) Any jurisdiction which is a party to this Compact and which (1) 25receives a request for assistance shall take such actions as are necessary to provide 26 requested resources. 27 (2) Any PARTY jurisdiction may withhold resources to the extent 28 necessary to provide reasonable protection to its own jurisdiction. 29 Each party jurisdiction shall afford to the emergency responders (3) 30 of any party jurisdiction operating within the requesting jurisdiction under the terms and conditions of this Compact, the same powers, duties, rights, and privileges as are afforded 31 32 those of the jurisdiction in which they are performing emergency services.
- 33 (4) Emergency responders will continue under the command and 34 control of their regular leaders, but the organizational units will come under the 35 operational control of the emergency services authorities of the requesting jurisdiction.

2 3 4	(g) (1) Party jurisdictions are encouraged to consult frequently with each other and with the Maryland Emergency Management Agency and to exchange information and plans relating to emergency management.
5 6 7	(2) (I) This Compact shall become effective immediately upon its enactment into law by [local] ANY TWO jurisdictions IN A FORM SUBSTANTIALLY SIMILAR TO THE COMPACT SET FORTH IN THIS SUBTITLE.
8 9 10	(II) THEREAFTER, THIS COMPACT SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE AS TO ANY OTHER JURISDICTION UPON ITS ENACTMENT BY THAT JURISDICTION.

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October 1, 2020.
