A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Senior Citizen Activities Center Operating Fund – Funding and Distribution

- 3 FOR the purpose of increasing the amount of funding required to be included in the annual State budget for the Senior Citizen Activities Center Operating Fund; altering the 4 5 distribution of the Fund; requiring a certain percentage of the Fund to be distributed 6 based on each county's share of the senior citizen population; requiring a certain 7 percentage of the Fund to be distributed based on each county's share of the 8 population of senior citizens with income below a certain percentage of the federal 9 poverty level; and generally relating to the Senior Citizen Activities Center Operating Fund. 10

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 Article – Human Services

- 20 (a) The Fund is a continuing, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to § 7–302 of the 21 State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 22 (b) (1) The Fund consists of appropriations that are made to the Fund from 23 the State budget.

- 1 (2) For each fiscal year, the Governor shall include in the annual State budget an appropriation of [\$500,000] **\$1,000,000** for the Fund.
- 3 (c) (1) Subject to [paragraph (2)] PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) of this subsection, money from the Fund shall be distributed to counties for senior citizen activities centers based on a competitive grant process administered by the Department.
- 6 (2) [At least 50% of the Fund shall be distributed for senior citizen activities centers on the basis of need, as determined by the Department, to counties:
- 8 (i) that have developed and submitted a local strategic plan for 9 economic development that has been approved by the Secretary of Commerce; and

- 1. the average rate of unemployment for the most recent 12 18—month period for which data is available is greater than 150% of the average rate of 13 unemployment for the entire State during that same period; or
- the average per capita personal income for the most recent 24—month period for which data is available is equal to or less than 67% of the average personal per capita income for the entire State during that same period.]
