## 2 Senior Citizen Activities Center Operating Fund – Funding and Distribution 3 **Distributions – Alteration**

4 FOR the purpose of increasing the amount of funding required to be included in the annual State budget for the Senior Citizen Activities Center Operating Fund; altering the 5 6 distribution of the Fund; requiring a certain percentage amount of the Fund to be 7 distributed based on each county's share of the statewide senior citizen population; 8 requiring a certain percentage of the Fund to be distributed based on each county's 9 share of the population of senior citizens with income below a certain percentage of 10 the federal poverty level; that each county receive a minimum amount of funding; 11 defining a certain term; altering the qualification criteria for certain need-based distributions from the Senior Citizen Activities Center Operating Fund to certain 12 counties; and generally relating to the administration of the Senior Citizen Activities 13 Center Operating Fund. 14
