- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Community Health and Public Safety $\mathbf{5}$ Center of Excellence within the Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth, and 6 Victim Services; establishing the purposes of the Center; authorizing the Center to 7 enter into contracts with certain entities or organizations for certain purposes; 8 requiring that the activities of the Center include certain planning, assistance, and 9 coordination; requiring the Center to provide technical assistance to local governments for certain purposes; requiring the Center to host a certain summit at 10 11 certain intervals for certain purposes; requiring the Center to support certain 12workshops and summarize certain rules in certain reports, implement certain 13 systems and policies, and produce and update a certain plan on or before a certain 14date each year; establishing requirements for the plan; requiring each local 15jurisdiction to develop a certain plan in collaboration with certain persons; requiring 16 the plan to include certain elements; authorizing a local jurisdiction to use an 17existing local planning and coordinating committee or local management board to 18 satisfy certain requirements; requiring the Center to prioritize the disbursement of certain federal funds received by the Center for certain purposes; defining certain 1920terms; and generally relating to health and safety in the State.

26 27	(1) LEAD THE DEVELOPMENT OF A STRATEGIC PLAN TO ENHANCE COMMUNITY HEALTH AND PUBLIC SAFETY;

- 21 (2) TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE; AND
- 22 (3) STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT COORDINATION.
- 23 (B) THE CENTER SHALL PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO LOCAL 24 GOVERNMENTS FOR THE PURPOSES OF:
- 25 (1) SHARING BEST PRACTICES ACROSS JURISDICTIONS;

26 (2) APPLYING FOR GRANTS TO SUPPORT WORK RELATED TO 27 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND JUSTICE;

28 (3) FACILITATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF RESOURCES, TECHNICAL 29 ASSISTANCE, AND TRAINING IN BEST PRACTICES RELATED TO PROGRAMS ALONG 30 ALL INTERCEPTS OF THE COMMUNITY HEALTH AND PUBLIC SAFETY SYSTEM; 1 (4) FACILITATING PROVISION OF TRAIN-THE-TRAINER COURSES 2 FOR THE SEQUENTIAL INTERCEPT MODEL FOR COMPLETION IN 2021 IN 3 PARTNERSHIP WITH THE FEDERAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND MENTAL HEALTH 4 SERVICES ADMINISTRATION, WITH THE GOAL OF TRAINING 50 INDIVIDUALS ACROSS 5 THE STATE AS FACILITATORS; AND

8 (C) THE CENTER SHALL HOST ONE STATE SEQUENTIAL INTERCEPT MODEL 9 SUMMIT EVERY 2 YEARS FOR THE PURPOSE OF SHARING BEST PRACTICES ACROSS 10 JURISDICTIONS AND TRACKING THE PROGRESSION OF MARYLAND'S COMMUNITY 11 HEALTH AND PUBLIC SAFETY SYSTEM.

12 (D) THE CENTER SHALL SUPPORT COUNTY OR REGIONAL SEQUENTIAL 13 INTERCEPT MODEL MAPPING WORKSHOPS AND SUMMARIZE RESULTS IN REPORTS 14 THAT INFORM CROSS-AGENCY PLANNING AND PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT.

15 (E) THE CENTER SHALL IMPLEMENT SYSTEMS AND POLICIES THAT 16 ESTABLISH A REGIONAL APPROACH TO COMMUNITY HEALTH AND PUBLIC SAFETY, 17 INCLUDING BY:

18 (1) FACILITATING MULTIJURISDICTIONAL APPLICATIONS FOR 19 FEDERAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE GRANTS;

20 (2) COORDINATING AND CONNECTING SIMILAR PROGRAMS ACROSS 21 MULTIPLE JURISDICTIONS; AND

22 (3) ASSISTING LOCALITIES IN BROADENING AND FORMALIZING 23 COUNTY-LEVEL COLLABORATION IN COMMUNITY HEALTH AND PUBLIC SAFETY.

- 8 (2) TRAINING FOR 9–1–1 OPERATORS;
- 9 (3) PEER SUPPORT SERVICES;
- 10 (4) BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SCREENINGS; AND

11 (5) SCHOLARSHIPS FOR STUDENTS WHO ATTEND A MARYLAND 12 HBCU TO STUDY CRIMINAL JUSTICE–RELATED ISSUES.
