

Motor Vehicles - Disability Parking Placards - Photo Identification

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration, on request, to issue a
- 4 disability parking placard with an embedded color photograph of the placard holder;
- 5 requiring a parking placard with an embedded color photograph of the placard holder
- 6 to include a privacy sleeve that allows a person to freely display or hide the color
- 7 photograph; and generally relating to disability parking placards.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 15 Article Transportation
- 16 13–616.1.
- 17 (a) A person may apply to the Administration for a parking placard on a form
- 18 provided by the Administration if the applicant:
- 19 (1) Is a resident of the State; and
- 20 (2) (i) Has a permanent disability as described in § 13–616(b)(1) of this
- 21 subtitle and as certified by a licensed physician, licensed physician assistant, licensed
- 22 chiropractor, licensed optometrist, licensed podiatrist, or licensed physical therapist, as
- 23 defined in § 13–616(a) of this subtitle; or



- 1 (ii) Has a permanent disability as described in § 13–616(b)(1)(vi) of 2 this subtitle and as self-certified as provided by § 13–616(b)(2)(iv) of this subtitle.
- 3 (b) (1) A parking placard for a person with a disability may be issued to an applicant described in subsection (a) of this section only if the applicant submits proof satisfactory to the Administration that the applicant is a person with a disability as described in § 13–616(b) of this subtitle.
- 7 (2) A parent or legal guardian may apply for a special disability parking 8 placard on behalf of a qualified minor.
- 9 (c) (1) Except as provided in § 13–616(c) of this subtitle, the Administration 10 may not issue to an applicant:
- 11 (i) More than one placard if the applicant requests one set of special registration plates under § 13–616 of this subtitle; or
- 13 (ii) More than two placards if the applicant does not request a set of special registration plates under § 13–616 of this subtitle.
- 15 (2) Except as provided in § 13–616(c) of this subtitle, the Administration 16 may not issue to a person issued special vehicle registration plates under § 13–616 of this 17 subtitle a combination of special disability registration plates and placards exceeding two.
- 18 (d) (1) (i) A placard issued under this section to an applicant described in 19 subsection (a) of this section is valid until the death of the placard holder.
- 20 (ii) On receipt of notification of the death of the placard holder, the 21 Administration shall mark the record of the placard as expired and shall send notice to the 22 last known address of the placard holder requesting the return of the placard to the 23 Administration.
- 24 (2) If a placard is lost, stolen, or damaged, the placard holder may apply 25 for a replacement placard on an application form and in the manner required by the 26 Administration.
- 27 (e) (1) A parking placard for a person with a disability shall be issued:
- 28 (i) Except as provided in item (ii) or item (iii) of this paragraph, in 29 the form of a removable windshield placard capable of being hung from the inside rearview 30 mirror and of a size and design as determined by the Administration;
- 31 (ii) For a vehicle not equipped with an inside rearview mirror or in 32 which the inside rearview mirror is not visible from the rear of the vehicle, in the form of a 33 windshield placard of a size and design as determined by the Administration; or



- 28 (IV) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL TAKE A COLOR PHOTOGRAPH 29 EMBEDDED ON A PARKING PLACARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH A PROCEDURE THAT THE 30 ADMINISTRATION REQUIRES.
- 31 (f) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, when displayed 32 by the person to whom a removable windshield placard is issued, the removable windshield 33 placard shall be hung from the inside rearview mirror when the vehicle is parked.

- 1 (2) A person may not drive a vehicle while a removable windshield placard 2 described under paragraph (1) of this subsection is hanging from the inside rearview 3 mirror.
 - (3) The removable windshield placard shall be placed inside a vehicle that is not equipped with an inside rearview mirror, in a position from which the removable windshield placard can be viewed from the outside of the vehicle through the lower portion of the windshield on the driver's side of the vehicle.
- 8 (4) When displayed, the person to whom a removable windshield placard is 9 issued under this section or under a similar provision of law of any state or country is 10 accorded the privileges contained in § 13–616(f) of this subtitle.
- 11 (g) When using the parking privileges granted under § 13–616(f) of this subtitle:
- 12 (1) The person shall have in the person's possession identification issued 13 by the Administration as proof that parking privileges are being utilized by a person with 14 a disability as defined in § 13–616(b)(1) of this subtitle; and
- 15 (2) The person shall make the identification available upon the request of:
- 16 (i) A police officer, while the officer is discharging the official duties 17 of a police officer; or
- 18 (ii) Any other person authorized by a political subdivision to enforce 19 this section, while acting within the scope of this authority.
- 20 (h) (1) A person may not commit any fraud or make any misrepresentation in 21 certifying a person's disability or applying for or using a parking placard for a person with 22 a disability.
- 23 (2) A person who operates a motor vehicle displaying a parking placard for 24 a person with a disability may not use the privileges granted under this section, unless the 25 person is:
- 26 (i) A person with a disability who meets the requirements of § 27 13-616(b)(1) of this subtitle; or
- 28 (ii) Accompanied by a dependent, or an individual who depends on 29 the person for transportation, who meets the requirements of § 13–616(b)(1) of this subtitle.
- 30 (3) To determine if the eligibility requirements continue to be met, the 31 Administration may conduct a review of a parking placard for a person with a disability 32 that is issued by the Administration under this section and:

- 1 (i) If the Administration finds it necessary to review the severity or 2 permanency of a placard holder's disability, the Administration may request a review and 3 recommendations from the Medical Advisory Board established under § 16–118 of this 4 article; and
- 5 (ii) If the Administration determines that eligibility requirements 6 are not being met, the Administration may revoke the parking placard for a person with a 7 disability.
 - (i) The Administration shall:

- 9 (1) Administer the removable windshield placard program in accordance 10 with the provisions of this section; and
- 11 (2) By July 1, 2001, establish an automated system for recording the 12 issuance, renewal, and expiration of placards in a timely manner to ensure that the 13 objectives of the placard program are achieved in an efficient and orderly manner.
- 14 (j) In accordance with the provisions of this section, each board for licensed physicians, licensed physician assistants, licensed chiropractors, licensed optometrists, licensed podiatrists, or licensed physical therapists shall be responsible for the development and maintenance of a database system, with which the Administration can interface and verify licensure.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 20 October 1, 2024.
