- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 18 Article Election Law
- 19 9-501.

- 1 (a) This subtitle applies only to a special election that is not held concurrently 2 with a regularly scheduled primary or general election.
- 3 (b) Voting by mail may be utilized in a special election in accordance with this 4 subtitle.
- 5 (c) A special election to fill a vacancy in the Office of Representative in Congress 6 shall be conducted by mail if the Governor's proclamation issued under § 8–710 of this 7 article directs that the election be conducted by mail.
- 8 (d) (1) In this subsection, "local special election" means a special election to:
- 9 (i) fill a vacancy in the offices of county council member, chief 10 executive officer, or county executive of a charter county if the charter of that county 11 provides for special elections;
- 12 (ii) fill a vacancy in the board of county commissioners of a code 13 home rule county if a local law enacted by that county provides for special elections;
- 14 (iii) fill a vacancy in the board of county commissioners of a commission county if a law provides for special elections;
- 16 (iv) fill a vacancy in a local board of education if State law provides 17 for special elections;
- 18 (v) elect members of a charter board or submit a proposed charter to 19 the voters for adoption or rejection in accordance with Article XI–A, § 1A of the Maryland 20 Constitution; or
- 21 (vi) submit a local law enacted by a code home rule county to the 22 voters for adoption or rejection in accordance with § 9–313 of the Local Government Article.
- 23 (2) A local special election shall be conducted by mail if the resolution of 24 the county council or board of county commissioners establishing the date of the special 25 election directs that the election be conducted by mail.
- 26 (e) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle:
- 27 (1) provisions of this article relating to absentee voting apply to voting by 28 mail; and
- 29 (2) all pertinent State or local laws relating to the conduct of a special 30 election apply to a special election conducted under this subtitle.

1 2 3	(f) Provisions of this article relating to the conduct of elections apply to a special election conducted under this subtitle, unless a law specifically relevant to a special election applies.

5 6 7	(a) Each local board shall establish at least one voting center for the use of any eligible voter who chooses to cast a ballot in person in a special election in accordance with this section.
8 9	(b) (1) A voting center shall be located at a local board office or another location within the constituency where the special election is being held.
10	(2) In Montgomery County AND PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY:
11 12 13	(i) in a special election held in a single county council district, at least one voting center shall be established in the county council district where the special election is being held; and
14 15	(ii) in a countywide special election, at least one voting center shall be established in each county council district.
16	(c) A voting center established under this section shall:
17 18 19	(1) provide access to a voting system that is accessible to voters with disabilities in accordance with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act and the federal Help America Vote Act;
20	(2) provide for provisional voting in accordance with Subtitle 4 of this title;
21	(3) satisfy the requirements of § 10–101 of this article; and
22 23 24 25	(4) (i) unless otherwise specified in the proclamation issued by the Governor that directs that the special election be conducted by mail, and except as provided in item (ii) of this item, be open for voting each day beginning 6 days before the day of a special election through the day of a special election during the hours between:
26	1. 10 a.m. and 8 p.m. Monday through Saturday; and
27	2. 12 noon to 6 p.m. on Sunday; and
28 29 30	(ii) in Montgomery County AND PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY , be open for voting during the days and for the hours that the county council directs in the resolution under § 9–501(d)(2) of this subtitle.

}	(d) If necessary to expedite the conduct of a special election and subject to the approval of the State Board, a local board may establish a voting center under this section during a period when a change in polling places is prohibited under § 2–303 of this articles.
,	(e) The process for applying in person for an absentee ballot at the office of a loc board under § 9–305 of this title does not apply to a special election conducted by mail.
3	(f) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any provision of this article th applies to voting at a polling place on election day also applies to voting at a voting cent established under this section.
