## A BILL ENTITLED

## 2 Environment - Impact of Actions on Climate, Labor, and Environmental Justice

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a certain governmental unit from taking an action unless 4 the governmental unit has conducted certain evaluations and assessments of the 5 impact of the action on the climate, labor and employment, environmental justice, 6 and any overburdened community; authorizing a governmental unit to deny, 7 condition, approve, or amend an action based on certain findings; requiring 8 governmental units to coordinate and seek federal funding to meet the requirements 9 of this Act; and generally relating to the impact of actions on climate, labor, and environmental justice. 10

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- SUBTITLE 9. IMPACT OF ACTIONS ON CLIMATE, LABOR, AND ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE.

- 23 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 24 INDICATED.

- 1 (B) "ACTION" INCLUDES THE WHOLE OR A PART OF A RULE, AN ORDER, A LICENSE, AN APPROVAL, A DENIAL SANCTION, OR RELIEF ISSUED BY A
- 3 GOVERNMENTAL UNIT.
- 4 (C) "ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 1–701(A) 5 OF THIS TITLE.
- 6 (D) "LOW-INCOME" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO RESIDES IN A HOUSEHOLD THAT HAS AN ANNUAL HOUSEHOLD INCOME THAT IS AT OR BELOW 200% OF THE FEDERAL POVERTY GUIDELINES.
- 9 (E) (1) "OVERBURDENED COMMUNITY" MEANS:
- 10 (I) A LOW-INCOME OR MODERATE-INCOME COMMUNITY; OR
- 11 (II) A COMMUNITY OF COLOR IN WHICH THE RESIDENTS EITHER
- 12 PRESENTLY OR HISTORICALLY HAVE BEEN BURDENED BY DISPROPORTIONATELY
- 13 HIGH NUMBERS OF ENVIRONMENTAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH STRESSORS, INCLUDING
- 14 POLLUTION, ADVERSE HEALTH EFFECTS DUE TO POLLUTION, REDUCED
- 15 WELL-BEING, AND DIMINISHED ECONOMIC SUCCESS.
- 16 (2) "OVERBURDENED COMMUNITY" INCLUDES:
- 17 (I) ANY CENSUS TRACT IN WHICH, ACCORDING TO THE MOST 18 RECENT U.S. CENSUS BUREAU SURVEY:
- 19 1. At least 25% of the residents qualify as
- 20 LOW-INCOME;
- 21 2. AT LEAST 50% OF THE RESIDENTS IDENTIFY AS
- 22 NONWHITE; OR
- 3. At least 25% of the residents have limited
- 24 ENGLISH PROFICIENCY; OR
- 25 (II) AN AREA OR A NEIGHBORHOOD DESIGNATED BY THE
- 26 SECRETARY AS AN OVERBURDENED COMMUNITY IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 1–902 OF
- 27 THIS SUBTITLE.
- 28 **1–902**.
- 29 (A) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION AND ON PETITION OF AT

- 1 LEAST 10 RESIDENTS OF AN AREA OR A NEIGHBORHOOD LOCATED WITHIN A CENSUS
- 2 TRACT THAT DOES NOT MEET THE CRITERIA SPECIFIED IN § 1-901(E)(2)(I) OF THIS
- 3 SUBTITLE, THE SECRETARY MAY DESIGNATE THE AREA OR NEIGHBORHOOD AS AN
- 4 OVERBURDENED COMMUNITY IF THE SECRETARY DETERMINES THAT THE AREA OR
- 5 NEIGHBORHOOD OTHERWISE QUALIFIES AS AN OVERBURDENED COMMUNITY.
- 6 (B) THE SECRETARY MAY DENY A PETITION SUBMITTED UNDER
- 7 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION IF THE SECRETARY DETERMINES THAT THE AREA
- 8 OR NEIGHBORHOOD THAT IS THE SUBJECT OF THE PETITION:
- 9 (1) HAS AN ANNUAL MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME THAT EXCEEDS
- 10 125% OF THE STATEWIDE MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME;
- 11 (2) HAS A MAJORITY OF INDIVIDUALS AT LEAST 25 YEARS OLD THAT
- 12 HAVE A COLLEGE EDUCATION;
- 13 (3) Does not bear an unfair burden of environmental
- 14 POLLUTION; AND
- 15 (4) HAS MORE THAN LIMITED ACCESS TO NATURAL RESOURCES,
- 16 INCLUDING OPEN SPACES, WATER RESOURCES, AND PLAYGROUNDS AND OTHER
- 17 CONSTRUCTED OUTDOOR RECREATIONAL FACILITIES AND VENUES.

- 19 A GOVERNMENTAL UNIT MAY NOT TAKE AN ACTION UNLESS THE
- 20 GOVERNMENTAL UNIT HAS CONDUCTED THE EVALUATIONS, ASSESSMENTS, AND
- 21 RELATED ACTIVITIES REQUIRED UNDER § 1–904 OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 22 **1–904.**
- 23 (A) BEFORE TAKING AN ACTION, A GOVERNMENTAL UNIT SHALL EVALUATE
- 24 AND MAKE A DETERMINATION ON WHETHER AND TO WHAT EXTENT THE ACTION MAY
- 25 NEGATIVELY AFFECT THE CLIMATE, LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT, ENVIRONMENTAL
- 26 JUSTICE, AND ANY OVERBURDENED COMMUNITY.
- 27 (B) AN EVALUATION CONDUCTED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE
- 28 CONSIDERATION AND ANALYSIS OF:
- 29 (1) THE IMPACT OF THE ACTION ON THE ENVIRONMENT, INCLUDING:
- 30 (I) THE GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS AND CLIMATE EFFECTS
- 31 OF THE ACTION BASED ON THE BEST AVAILABLE SCIENTIFIC INFORMATION

- 1 RECOGNIZED BY THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL PANEL ON CLIMATE CHANGE;
- 2 (II) WHETHER THE GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS AND CLIMATE
- 3 EFFECTS OF THE ACTION ARE CONSISTENT WITH THE STATE'S CLIMATE
- 4 COMMITMENTS FOR REDUCING STATEWIDE GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS,
- 5 INCLUDING THOSE SPECIFIED IN TITLE 2, SUBTITLE 12 OF THIS ARTICLE;
- 6 (III) THE EFFECT OF CLIMATE CHANGE ON THE ACTION BASED
- 7 ON THE BEST AVAILABLE SCIENTIFIC INFORMATION RECOGNIZED BY THE
- 8 INTERGOVERNMENTAL PANEL ON CLIMATE CHANGE; AND
- 9 (IV) THE POTENTIAL GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS SAVINGS
- 10 ASSOCIATED WITH USING A CARBON-FREE ENERGY SOURCE AS AN ALTERNATIVE TO
- 11 A PROPOSED ENERGY SOURCE.
- 12 (2) THE IMPACT OF THE ACTION ON LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT,
- 13 INCLUDING WHETHER THE EMPLOYERS, CONTRACTORS, AND SUBCONTRACTORS
- 14 ASSOCIATED WITH ANY PROJECT RESULTING FROM THE ACTION:
- 15 (I) PAY THE AREA PREVAILING WAGE FOR EACH TRADE,
- 16 INCLUDING WAGES AND FRINGE BENEFITS;
- 17 (II) OFFER HEALTH CARE AND RETIREMENT BENEFITS TO THE
- 18 EMPLOYEES WORKING ON THE PROJECT OR AN ITEM ASSOCIATED WITH THE
- 19 **PROJECT**;
- 20 (III) PARTICIPATE IN AN APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM
- 21 REGISTERED WITH THE STATE FOR EACH TRADE EMPLOYED ON A PROJECT OR
- 22 OTHER ITEM ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROJECT;
- 23 (IV) ESTABLISH AND EXECUTE A PLAN FOR OUTREACH,
- 24 RECRUITMENT, AND RETENTION OF STATE RESIDENTS TO PERFORM WORK ON A
- 25 PROJECT OR OTHER ITEM ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROJECT, WITH AN ASPIRATIONAL
- 26 GOAL OF 25% OF TOTAL WORK HOURS PERFORMED BY STATE RESIDENTS,
- 27 INCLUDING RESIDENTS WHO ARE:
- 28 1. RETURNING CITIZENS;
- 29 **2. Women**;
- 3. MINORITY INDIVIDUALS; OR
- 31 4. VETERANS;

- 1 (V) HAVE BEEN IN COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL AND STATE 2 WAGE AND HOUR LAWS FOR THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING 3 YEARS;
- 3 (VI) ARE IN GOOD STANDING WITH ALL STATE REPORTING AND 4 COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS; AND
- 5 (VII) MAINTAIN ALL APPROPRIATE LICENSES IN GOOD 6 STANDING; AND
- 7 (3) THE IMPACT OF THE ACTION ON ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE AND 8 ANY OVERBURDENED COMMUNITY, INCLUDING THE POTENTIAL FOR:
- 9 (I) THE DETERIORATION OF PUBLIC HEALTH;
- 10 (II) AN INCREASE IN POLLUTION, INCLUDING THE ASSOCIATED BURDEN TO PUBLIC HEALTH AND THE ENVIRONMENT; AND
- 12 (III) A NEGATIVE IMPACT ON THE ECONOMIC WELL-BEING OF 13 RESIDENTS OF THE STATE.
- 14 (C) (1) BASED ON THE EVALUATIONS CONDUCTED UNDER SUBSECTION
- 15 (B) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A GOVERNMENTAL UNIT SHALL ISSUE A WRITTEN
- 16 GENERAL IMPACT REPORT THAT INDICATES WHETHER AND TO WHAT EXTENT A
- 17 PROPOSED ACTION MAY NEGATIVELY AFFECT THE CLIMATE, LABOR AND
- 18 EMPLOYMENT, ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE, OR ANY OVERBURDENED COMMUNITY.
- 19 **(2)** A GOVERNMENTAL UNIT THAT ISSUES A GENERAL IMPACT 20 REPORT UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL MAKE THE REPORT PUBLICLY AVAILABLE.
- 21 (D) If A GOVERNMENTAL UNIT DETERMINES THAT AN ACTION MAY
- 22 NEGATIVELY AFFECT AN OVERBURDENED COMMUNITY, THE GOVERNMENTAL UNIT
- 23 SHALL:
- 24 (1) CONDUCT FURTHER ASSESSMENT SUPPORTED BY DATA, STUDIES, 25 OR OTHER APPROPRIATE SOURCES, INCLUDING:
- 26 (I) AN ANALYSIS OF THE NEGATIVE IMPACTS ON THE 27 OVERBURDENED COMMUNITY; AND
- 28 (II) AN ANALYSIS OF THE MEASURES NECESSARY TO
- 29 SUBSTANTIALLY DECREASE OR ELIMINATE THE NEGATIVE IMPACTS ON THE
- 30 OVERBURDENED COMMUNITY;

- 1 (2) ASSESS OPPORTUNITIES TO DIRECT PROCEEDS, BENEFITS, OR
- 2 INVESTMENTS WHICH MAY RESULT FROM THE ACTION IN A MANNER THAT WILL
- 3 BENEFIT THE OVERBURDENED COMMUNITY;
- 4 (3) ENGAGE IN MEANINGFUL COMMUNICATION WITH THE PUBLIC REGARDING THE NEGATIVE IMPACTS AND POSSIBLE MITIGATION STRATEGIES; AND
- 6 (4) REVISE THE GENERAL IMPACT REPORT REQUIRED UNDER 7 SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION TO REFLECT THE FINDINGS UNDER THIS
- 8 SUBSECTION.
- 9 (E) A GOVERNMENTAL UNIT MAY DENY, CONDITION, APPROVE, OR AMEND
- 10 AN ACTION BASED ON ITS FINDINGS UNDER SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION.
- 11 **1–905.**
- 12 GOVERNMENTAL UNITS SHALL COORDINATE AND SEEK FEDERAL FUNDING,
- 13 INCLUDING FUNDING AVAILABLE UNDER THE FEDERAL INFRASTRUCTURE
- 14 INVESTMENT AND JOBS ACT, TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
