- WHEREAS, Drug addiction is a chronic disease, characterized by compulsive or difficult to control drug use despite harmful consequences; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Drug addiction is seen by both the Centers for Disease Control and
- 22 Prevention and the World Health Organization as a fast–growing epidemic that can all too
- 23 easily lead to overdose and death; and
- 24 WHEREAS, For every drug overdose that results in death, there are many more
- 25 nonfatal overdoses, each taking an emotional and economic toll on the individual, their



- 1 family, and the community at large; and
- WHEREAS, Drug addiction can fuel feelings of shame, guilt, embarrassment,
- 3 depression, and hopelessness, causing individuals to resist seeking treatment and support;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, Overdose Awareness Day is a global event held on August 31 each year
- 6 that aims to raise awareness of drug overdoses, reduce the stigma of a drug-related death,
- 7 and acknowledge the grief felt by families and friends remembering those who have died or
- 8 had a permanent injury as a result of a drug overdose; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Recognizing Overdose Awareness Day in Maryland sends a strong
- 10 message to former or current substance users, namely, that they are valued, and that
- 11 overdose death is preventable; now, therefore,
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 13 That Section(s) 7–414 through 7–417, respectively, of Article General Provisions of the
- 14 Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7-415 through 7-418,
- 15 respectively.

- 22 (B) THE GOVERNOR ANNUALLY SHALL ORDER THE STATE FLAG TO BE
- 23 FLOWN AT HALF-STAFF ON AUGUST 31.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
- 25 1, 2021.
