- 2 (a) Following an election, each local board shall meet at its designated counting 3 center to canvass the absentee ballots cast in that election in accordance with the 4 regulations and guidelines established by the State Board.
- 5 (d) (3) The local board shall reject an absentee ballot if:
- 6 (i) [before the ballot is canvassed, the local board determines that 7 the voter died before election day;
- 8 (ii) the voter failed to sign the oath on the ballot envelope;
- 9 [(iii)] (II) the local board received more than one ballot from the 10 same individual for the same election in the same ballot envelope; or
- [(iv)] (III) the local board determines that an absentee ballot is intentionally marked with an identifying mark that is clearly evident and placed on the ballot for the purpose of identifying the ballot.

- A BALLOT CAST BY A VOTER WHO DIES BEFORE THE BALLOT IS CANVASSED
 SHALL BE COUNTED IN FULL UNLESS A LAW OR REGULATION REQUIRES THAT THE
 BALLOT BE FULLY OR PARTIALLY REJECTED FOR A REASON UNRELATED TO THE
 DEATH OF THE VOTER.
