<u>f</u>	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the ollowing terms have the following meanings.
	A. "Horse" includes all members of the genus Equus, including horses, ponies, donkeys, mules, asses and burros.
	B. "Horseflesh" means the flesh of a dead horse and includes the animal's viscera, skin, hair, hide, hooves and bones.
	C. "Person" means an individual, corporation, partnership, trust, association or other legal entity.
r	2. Prohibition against horse slaughter. A person may not slaughter or otherwise ause or procure the death of, or have another person slaughter or otherwise cause or rocure the death of, a horse if that person knows or should know that any of the orseflesh is intended for human consumption.
	3. Prohibition against possession of horse for slaughter. A person may not sell,
	arter, give away or purchase or offer to sell, barter or purchase or possess, transport,
	eliver or receive a horse with the intent of slaughtering or otherwise causing or
_	rocuring the death of, or having another person slaughter or otherwise cause or procure

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	4. Prohibition against export or import of horse for slaughter. A person may not
	nport into or export from this State a live horse when that person knows or should know

	5. Prohibition against sale, purchase, possession, import or export of horseflesh.

	6. Prohibition against construction or operation of horse slaughtering facility.

	7. Penalty. A person who violates this section commits a Class C crime. A court
r	hay also order any person convicted of violating this section to submit to a mental health
	valuation as determined by the court and undergo any recommended counseling or
	reatment. In addition to any other penalty provided by law, a person convicted under this
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t	ection may be barred from owning or possessing any animals, or living on the same
