Resolve, to Establish the Task Force to Study Barriers to Achieving Behavioral Health Integration and Parity

(EMERGENCY)

Presented by Representative PERRY of Calais. Cosponsored by Senator BAILEY of York and Representatives: BRENNAN of Portland, DHALAC of South Portland, MADIGAN of Waterville. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, this legislation establishes the Task Force to Study Barriers to Achieving Behavioral Health Integration and Parity to study barriers imposed by insurers and experienced by providers in attempting to deliver behavioral health services; and

Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

- **Sec. 1. Task force established. Resolved:** That the Task Force to Study Barriers to Achieving Behavioral Health Integration and Parity, referred to in this resolve as "the task force," is established.
- **Sec. 2. Task force membership. Resolved:** That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the task force consists of 13 members appointed as follows:
- 1. Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, including a member from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature;
- 2. Three members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, including members from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature;
- 3. Two members representing entities knowledgeable about or involved in providing behavioral health services, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 4. Three members who are providers of behavioral health services and represent a small group practice, a federally qualified health center and a large group practice, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and
- 5. Three members representing entities knowledgeable about or involved in insurance coverage for behavioral health treatment, including at least one member from the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Bureau of Insurance, appointed by the President of the Senate
- **Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved:** That the first-named Senate member is the Senate chair and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the task force.
- **Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of task force. Resolved:** That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. After appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the task force. If 30 days or more after the effective date of this resolve a majority of but not all appointments have been made, the chairs may request authority and the Legislative Council may grant authority for the task force to meet and conduct its business.

- **Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved:** That the task force shall study barriers imposed by insurers and experienced by providers in attempting to deliver behavioral health services and develop a plan, including specific legislative recommendations, to address and remove those barriers, allowing for better integrated care and parity in behavioral health treatment.
- **Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved:** That the Legislative Council shall provide necessary staffing services to the task force, except that Legislative Council staff support is not authorized when the Legislature is in regular or special session.
- **Sec. 7. Reports. Resolved:** That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, no later than December 6, 2023, the task force shall submit a report that includes findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services and the Joint Standing Committee on Health Coverage, Insurance and Financial Services. The committees may report out legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.

16 SUMMARY

 This resolve establishes the Task Force to Study Barriers to Achieving Behavioral Health Integration and Parity. The task force is directed to submit a report and any suggested legislation for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services and the Joint Standing Committee on Health Coverage, Insurance and Financial Services by December 6, 2023. The committees are authorized to report out legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.
