An Act to Require Photograph Identification for Voting

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- **Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §112-A, sub-§3,** as amended by PL 2021, c. 246, §1, is further amended to read:
- **3. Other official documents.** An official document, including, but not limited to, a document confirming eligibility determinations for public benefits, a utility bill, a bank statement, a government check, a paycheck or other government document that shows the name and address of the voter; <u>or</u>
- **Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §112-A, sub-§3-A,** as enacted by PL 2021, c. 246, §2, is repealed.
- **Sec. 3. 21-A MRSA §671, sub-§1,** as amended by PL 2019, c. 371, §20, is further amended to read:
- 1. Name announced; photograph identification. A voter who wishes to vote must present proof of identity in the form of a photograph identification document and state the voter's name and residence address to an election clerk, who shall announce the name in a loud, clear voice. If the voter's stated residence address is different from the residence address listed on the incoming voting list, the voter must be directed to complete an updated voter registration application before voting. For purposes of this subsection, "photograph identification document" means a valid driver's license or nondriver identification card issued in this State, a United States passport, a military identification or a permit to carry a concealed handgun issued under Title 25, chapter 252 if that permit includes a photograph. "Photograph identification document" does not include an identification issued by a college or university in this State.

Sec. 4. 21-A MRSA §671, sub-§9 is enacted to read:

- 9. Special voter photograph identification card. Notwithstanding subsection 1, a voter who wishes to vote and who does not possess a photograph identification document may request from the Secretary of State a special voter photograph identification card, which must be issued free of charge and is valid for voter identification under this section. The Secretary of State shall establish procedures through rulemaking for the issuance of special voter photograph identification cards under this subsection. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
 - Sec. 5. 21-A MRSA §752, sub-§5 is enacted to read:
- 5. Form of photograph identification notice. The Secretary of State shall design or approve the form of notice informing the voter that a copy of a photograph identification document must be submitted with the absentee ballot in accordance with section 754-B.
 - Sec. 6. 21-A MRSA §754-B is enacted to read:

§754-B. Photograph identification required

1. Photograph identification document. For the purposes of this section, "photograph identification document" has the same meaning as in section 671, subsection 1.

- 2. Photograph identification. A voter who wishes to vote by absentee ballot must submit with the absentee ballot proof of identity in the form of a copy of a photograph identification document or a special voter photograph identification card as described in subsection 3.
- 3. Special voter photograph identification. A voter who wishes to vote by absentee ballot and who does not possess a photograph identification document may request from the Secretary of State a special voter photograph identification card pursuant to section 671, subsection 9.
- 4. Rules. The Secretary of State shall adopt rules to implement this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
 - **Sec. 7. Effective date.** This Act takes effect January 1, 2024.

13 SUMMARY

This bill requires the presentation of proof of identity in the form of a photograph identification document when voting in person or by absentee ballot. Acceptable photograph identification is a valid driver's license or nondriver identification card issued in this State, a United States passport, a military identification or a permit to carry a concealed handgun issued in this State if that permit includes a photograph. An identification issued by a college or university in this State may not be accepted for voter identification when voting or when registering to vote. The bill also allows a person who does not possess a photograph identification document to request a free special voter photograph identification card from the Secretary of State.
