## An Act To Provide Funding for the Maine Coworking Development Fund

#### 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. Expansion of collaborative workspaces. The Department of Economic and Community Development shall provide funds from the Maine Coworking 3 Development Fund, as established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 4 5 13056-G, to entities that maintain collaborative workspace businesses to allow those entities to expand those collaborative workspace businesses. In providing funds pursuant 6 to this section, notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the department shall 7 give preference to applicants with collaborative workspace businesses located in 8 municipalities and counties in which the unemployment rate exceeds the State's 9 10 unemployment rate.

11 Sec. 2. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.
