An Act To Limit Homework in Public Schools

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §4711, as amended by PL 2019, c. 106, §1, is further amended to read:

§4711. Elementary course of study

The basic course of study for the elementary schools must provide for the instruction of all students in career and education development, English language arts, world languages, health education and physical education, mathematics, science and technology, social studies and visual and performing arts, as described in the parameters for essential instruction and graduation requirements subject to the schedule specified in section 6209. Health education must include instruction that addresses the relationship between physical and mental health in order to enhance student understanding of attitudes toward and behavior relating to mental illness and to eliminate the stigma associated with mental illness. Beginning in the 2023-2024 school year elementary students in kindergarten to grade 5 may not be assigned homework unless the school board of the school administrative unit has adopted a policy to permit the assignment of homework to elementary students.

Sec. 2. Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs to study homework limits for middle school and high school students. The Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs shall conduct a study on the use of homework in middle school and high school and determine recommendations regarding limiting homework for middle school and high school students beginning in the 2023-2024 school year. The Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs may submit legislation on the subject of the study to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature no later than January 15, 2022.

24 SUMMARY

This bill provides that, beginning in the 2023-2024 school year, elementary students in kindergarten to grade 5 may not be assigned homework unless the school board adopts a policy to permit the assignment of homework. This bill also directs the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs to conduct a study on the use of homework in middle school and high school and determine recommendations regarding limiting homework.
