1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 4 MRSA §454**, as amended by PL 2013, c. 159, §9, is repealed and the  
3 following enacted in its place:

4 **§454. Maine Criminal Justice Sentencing Institute**

5 **1. Institute established; purpose.** There is established the Maine Criminal Justice  
6 Sentencing Institute, referred to in this section as "the institute," under the administrative  
7 supervision of the State Court Administrator. The purpose of the institute is to provide a  
8 continuing forum for the regular discussion of the most appropriate methods of sentencing  
9 convicted offenders and adjudicated juveniles.

10 **2. Membership.** All Supreme Judicial Court, Superior Court and District Court  
11 Justices and Judges, all District Attorneys and all attorneys within the Criminal Division of  
12 the Office of the Attorney General are considered members of the institute. In addition,  
13 the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court shall invite, at a minimum, as members of  
14 the institute, law enforcement and correctional personnel, representatives of advisory and  
15 advocacy groups, including persons with expertise in sentencing reform and restorative  
16 justice and with experience in substance use disorder counseling, and representatives of the  
17 defense bar.

18 **3. Meetings; notice; public participation.** When sufficient funding is allocated by  
19 the Legislature, but no less often than once every 2 years, the institute shall meet, at the call  
20 of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court, for a 2-day period to discuss  
21 recommendations for changes in the sentencing authority and policies of the State's  
22 criminal and juvenile courts, in response to law enforcement problems and the available  
23 alternatives for criminal and juvenile rehabilitation within the State's correctional system.  
24 The Chief Justice shall post on the publicly accessible website of the judicial branch notice  
25 of the meeting, including the date, time and place of the meeting and the agenda, no later  
26 than 2 weeks prior to the meeting. The meeting must be open to the public, and the Chief  
27 Justice shall allow participation and input by the public.

28 **4. Compensation.** Members of the institute are not entitled to receive compensation  
29 for their services but are allowed, out of any appropriation or other fund made available for  
30 the purpose, reimbursement for expenses for clerical and other services, travel and  
31 incidentals as the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court may authorize.

32 **5. Biennial report.** Beginning January 15, 2024 and every 2 years thereafter, the  
33 Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court shall submit a report to the joint standing  
34 committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over judiciary matters and over criminal  
35 justice and public safety matters detailing, at a minimum, the membership of the institute,  
36 the matters discussed at the most recent meeting of the institute and any recommendations  
37 of the institute regarding matters considered by the institute. The joint standing committees  
38 may report out legislation based on the report.

39 **Sec. 2. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and  
40 allocations are made.

7 **SUMMARY**

8 This bill implements the recommendations of the Commission to Examine  
9 Reestablishing Parole regarding the Maine Criminal Justice Sentencing Institute by:

- 10 1. Modifying the membership to require that the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial  
11 Court invite, as members, representatives of advisory and advocacy groups, including  
12 persons with expertise in sentencing reform and restorative justice and experience in  
13 substance use disorder counseling;
- 14 2. Requiring that the institute meet at least once every 2 years;
- 15 3. Requiring that a meeting of the institute be advertised on the publicly accessible  
16 website of the judicial branch at least 2 weeks prior to the meeting. The notice must include  
17 the time, date and place of the meeting as well as the agenda;
- 18 4. Requiring that the meeting be open to the public, with public participation and input  
19 allowed;
- 20 5. Requiring the Chief Justice to submit a report to the joint standing committees of  
21 the Legislature having jurisdiction over judiciary matters and over criminal justice and  
22 public safety matters detailing, at a minimum, the membership of the institute, the matters  
23 discussed at the most recent meeting of the institute and any recommendations of the  
24 institute regarding matters considered by the institute. The joint standing committees are  
25 authorized to report out legislation based on the report; and
- 26 6. Making technical changes to the statute for readability and clarity.

27 This bill also provides for ongoing funding for the institute to allow it to meet  
28 biennially.
