SUMMARY

15 This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve. The amendment requires the Department of Health and Human Services to submit a request to the United States 16 Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services 17 to amend the current 1915(c) waiver so that eligible members receiving home and 18 19 community-based services under the department's rule Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter II, Section 19 will be able to receive services provided by relatives, 20 including spouses, or legal guardians who are employed to provide those services. It 21 22 requires the department to amend its rules after the amended waiver approval has been received from the Federal Government. The amendment requires the department to 23 24 provide an interim report and a final report regarding the progress in applying for, receiving and implementing the amended waiver, as well as data on the number of 25 individuals receiving services from relatives, including spouses, or legal guardians, any 26 information about costs or savings and recommendations about the feasibility for 27 similarly expanding other MaineCare programs or other potential waiver programs 28 29 available under Medicaid. It also adds an appropriations and allocations section.
