An Act To Expand Services to Persons Who Are Disabled or Elderly on Wait Lists by Reducing Revenue Sharing

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- **Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §5681, sub-§5-C,** as amended by PL 2013, c. 368, Pt. J, §1, is further amended to read:
  - **5-C. Transfers to General Fund.** For the months beginning on or after July 1, 2009, \$25,383,491 in fiscal year 2009-10, \$38,145,323 in fiscal year 2010-11, \$40,350,638 in fiscal year 2011-12, \$44,267,343 in fiscal year 2012-13, \$73,306,246 in fiscal year 2013-14 and \$85,949,391 \$103,949,391 in fiscal year 2014-15 from the total transfers pursuant to subsection 5 must be transferred to General Fund undedicated revenue. The amounts transferred to General Fund undedicated revenue each fiscal year pursuant to this subsection must be deducted from the distributions required by subsections 4-A and 4-B based on the percentage share of the transfers to the Local Government Fund pursuant to subsection 5. The reductions in this subsection must be allocated to each month proportionately based on the budgeted monthly transfers to the Local Government Fund as determined at the beginning of the fiscal year.
  - **Sec. 2.** Legislative intent for future allocations. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, it is the intent of the Legislature that, beginning with the 2016-2017 biennium, funding above the level of funding provided in fiscal year 2013-14 for the following come from the savings achieved by eliminating eligibility for the MaineCare program for parents with a household income equal to or greater than 100% of the nonfarm income official federal poverty level:
- 1. Community-based services provided under Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter II, Sections 21 and 29 and Chapter III, Sections 21 and 29;
  - 2. Homemaker services, home-based care and consumer-directed home-based care; and
  - 3. Brain injury residential and community services waiver in the MaineCare program.
- **Sec. 3. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and allocations are made.

17 SUMMARY

 This bill increases funding on an ongoing basis for developmental services waivers under Department of Health and Human Services Rule Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter II, Sections 21 and 29 and Chapter III, Sections 21 and 29 for consumer-directed home-based care and for the brain injury residental and community services waiver. In fiscal year 2014-15, the increased funding is offset by a reduction in the General Fund for municipal revenue sharing. The bill states that, after fiscal year 2014-15, it is the intent of the Legislature that funding for these allocations be paid for by savings achieved in the MaineCare budget as a result of the elimination of eligibility for parents with a household income equal to or greater than 100% of the nonfarm income official federal poverty level.
