An Act To Review State Lands and Waterways That Have Sacred, Traditional or Other Significance to the Wabanaki Tribes

(EMERGENCY)

1 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 3 Whereas, this legislation needs to take effect before the expiration of the 90-day period in order to identify before the convening of the First Regular Session of the 131st 4 Legislature state-owned lands or waterways that have sacred, traditional or other 5 significance to the Passamaquoddy Tribe, Penobscot Nation, Houlton Band of Maliseet 6 Indians or Aroostook Band of Micmacs; and 7 8 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 9 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 10 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 11 therefore, 12 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 13 **Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §12004-G, sub-§30-F** is enacted to read: 14 30-F. 15 Natural Commission To Review State-owned Not Authorized 12 MRSA <u>§18</u>09 16 Resources Lands and Waterways 17 Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §1809 is enacted to read: 18 §1809. Commission To Review State-owned Lands and Waterways 19 1. Established. The Commission To Review State-owned Lands and Waterways, referred to in this section as "the commission," is established. 20 21 **2. Members.** The members of the commission are as follows: 22 A. One member representing the bureau, appointed by the commissioner; 23 B. One member representing the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, appointed by the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife; 24 25 C. One member representing the Department of Marine Resources, appointed by the Commissioner of Marine Resources; 26 27 One member representing the Passamaquoddy Tribe, appointed by the 28 Passamaquoddy Tribe; 29 E. One member representing the Penobscot Nation, appointed by the Penobscot 30 Nation; 31 F. One member representing the Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians, appointed by the 32 Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians; and G. One member representing the Aroostook Band of Micmacs, appointed by the 33 34 Aroostook Band of Micmacs. 35 **3. Duties.** The commission shall: A. Identify which state-owned lands or waterways have sacred, traditional or other 36 significance to the Passamaquoddy Tribe, Penobscot Nation, Houlton Band of Maliseet 37 Indians or Aroostook Band of Micmacs; 38

- B. Examine the processes used in other states and by the Federal Government to return lands and waterways to tribes and develop a process to return lands and waterways to the Passamaquoddy Tribe, Penobscot Nation, Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians and Aroostook Band of Micmacs. The commission also shall identify resources to fund the cost to transfer these lands and waterways to the Passamaquoddy Tribe, Penobscot Nation, Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians and Aroostook Band of Micmacs; and
- C. Make recommendations to the Legislature, including recommendations regarding additional members who should be added to the commission.
- 4. Meetings. The commission shall hold public meetings and hearings throughout the State and shall accept testimony and written comments from the public. The commission shall invite the participation of stakeholders as determined by the commission and also invite the participation of large private landowners, land trusts and conservation organizations.
- 5. Report. The commission shall submit a report no later than November 15th of each year to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over conservation matters, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources matters. The joint standing committees may report out legislation related to the report of the commission.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.

22 SUMMARY

This bill establishes the Commission To Review State-owned Lands and Waterways to identify which state-owned lands or waterways have sacred, traditional or other significance to the Passamaquoddy Tribe, Penobscot Nation, Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians or Aroostook Band of Micmacs and develop a process to return lands and waterways to the Passamaquoddy Tribe, Penobscot Nation, Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians and Aroostook Band of Micmacs. The commission must hold public meetings and hearings throughout the State and must accept testimony and written comments from the public. The commission must invite the participation of stakeholders as determined by the commission and also invite the participation of large private landowners, land trusts and conservation organizations. The commission must submit a report no later than November 15th of each year to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over conservation matters, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources matters. The joint standing committees may report out legislation related to the report of the commission.
