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### **An Act To Provide Assistance to Areas Severely Infested with Browntail Moths**

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 7 MRSA c. 421** is enacted to read:

3 **CHAPTER 421**

4 **BROWNTAIL MOTH**

5 **§2491. Browntail moth control**

6 **1. Program.** The department shall administer a program to assist a government entity  
7 or nonprofit organization, upon application by that government entity or nonprofit  
8 organization to the department, with the control of browntail moths. This program must  
9 include the provision of resources, which may include resources for the mechanical,  
10 cultural or chemical control of the browntail moths; education campaigns; and other  
11 activities to mitigate browntail moth populations.

12 **2. Rules.** The department shall adopt routine technical rules, as described in Title 5,  
13 chapter 375, subchapter 2-A, to implement the provisions of this section.

14 **Sec. 2. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and  
15 allocations are made.

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**SUMMARY**

11       This bill requires the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to  
12 administer a program to assist a government entity or nonprofit organization, upon  
13 application by that government entity or nonprofit organization to the department, with the  
14 control of browntail moths. It also includes an appropriations and allocations section to  
15 provide funding for an Entomologist I position and a Senior Entomology Technician  
16 position in the department to support the management of forest insect pests.
