An Act To Improve the Reporting of Child Abuse

2 **Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §4011-A, sub-§1,** as amended by PL 2009, c. 211, Pt. B, §18 3 and PL 2011, c. 657, Pt. W, §5, is further amended to read: 4 1. Required report to department. The following adult persons shall immediately report or cause a report to be made to the department when the person knows or has 5 reasonable cause to suspect that a child has been or is likely to be abused or neglected or 6 that a suspicious child death has occurred: 7 8 A. When acting in a professional capacity: 9 (1) An allopathic or osteopathic physician, resident or intern; 10 (2) An emergency medical services person; 11 (3) A medical examiner; 12 (4) A physician's assistant; 13 (5) A dentist; 14 (6) A dental hygienist; 15 (7) A dental assistant; 16 (8) A chiropractor; 17 (9) A podiatrist; (10) A registered or licensed practical nurse; 18 (11) A teacher; 19 20 (12) A guidance counselor; 21 (13) A school official; 22 (14) A youth camp administrator or counselor; 23 (15) A social worker; (16) A court-appointed special advocate or guardian ad litem for the child; 24 25 (17) A homemaker; 26 (18) A home health aide; 27 (19) A medical or social service worker; (20) A psychologist; 28 29 (21) Child care personnel; (22) A mental health professional; 30 31 (23) A law enforcement official; 32 (24) A state or municipal fire inspector; 33 (25) A municipal code enforcement official;

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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1	(26) A commercial film and photographic print processor;
2 3 4	(27) A clergy member acquiring the information as a result of clerical professional work except for information received during confidential communications;
5 6	(28) A chair of a professional licensing board that has jurisdiction over mandated reporters;
7 8	(29) A humane agent employed by the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry;
9	(30) A sexual assault counselor;
10	(31) A family or domestic violence victim advocate; and
11	(32) A school bus driver or school bus attendant;
12 13 14	B. Any person who has assumed full, intermittent or occasional responsibility for the care or custody of the child, regardless of whether the person receives compensation and
15 16 17 18	C. Any person affiliated with a church or religious institution who serves in ar administrative capacity or has otherwise assumed a position of trust or responsibility to the members of that church or religious institution, while acting in that capacity regardless of whether the person receives compensation.
19 20 21 22 23	Whenever a person is required to report in a capacity as a member of the staff of a medical or public or private institution, agency or facility, that person immediately shall notify either the person in charge of the institution, agency or facility or a designated agent who then shall cause a report to be made. The staff also may make a report directly to the department.
24	SUMMARY
25 26 27	This bill amends the law regarding mandated reporters of suspected child abuse and neglect and of the suspicious death of a child by striking language allowing those reporters to cause someone else to make a report. Language requiring the individual mandated reporter to make a report is retained.
