2 3	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §8202, sub-§2, ¶ A , as amended by PL 1995, c. 665, Pt. FF, §1, is further amended to read:
4 5 6 7 8 9	A. The amount must be paid in 4 equal quarterly payments during the year of attendance. The first payment must be made by July 31st. The amount of tuition and other costs paid for all students is limited to the amount appropriated for this purpose in accordance with paragraph D. To be eligible for state funding under this paragraph, a student must have resided in Maine with a parent, other relative or guardian for at least 6 months immediately preceding application to the school.

The commissioner shall annually determine the total cost for providing essential programs and services for the school for students from this State in the same manner that total costs for providing essential programs and services for school administrative units are determined under chapter 606-B. Each fiscal year, the commissioner shall include that amount in the commissioner's funding levels recommendation submitted to the Governor and the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of the Budget pursuant to section 15689-C and the Governor shall include that funding level in the Governor's annual recommendation for funding levels pursuant to section 15689-D.
