1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §5401, sub-§15, ¶E is enacted to read:
3	E. Notwithstanding any other provision of this subsection, the commissioner shall
4	approve a request submitted by a school administrative unit to replace a conventional
5	school bus or transit-style school bus if the bus has:
6	(1) At least 150,000 accumulated miles; and
7	(2) Been in operation for 10 or more years, as determined by the commissioner.
8	The commissioner shall by rule define "conventional school bus" and "transit-style
9	school bus." Rules adopted pursuant to this paragraph are routine technical rules as
10	defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
11	Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §5401, sub-§18 is enacted to read:
12	18. School transportation operations. The department may not require a school
13	administrative unit to use a specific brand of routing and transportation management
14	software.
15	SUMMARY
16	This bill establishes in statute the criteria for the replacement of conventional and
17	transit-style school buses through the Department of Education and prohibits the
18	department from requiring a school administrative unit to use a specific brand of routing
19	and transportation management software.
