Department of Education truancy study. Resolved: That the 2 Department of Education shall conduct a study on truancy trends in the State and develop 3 recommendations for supporting school administrative units in increasing student 4 attendance and reducing truancy. In conducting the study under this section, the 5 department shall seek input from the Maine School Management Association, the Maine 6 Principals' Association and the Maine Education Association.

Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That, by January 4, 2022, the Department of Education
shall submit a report, including recommended legislation, based on its evaluation in section
1 to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs. The Joint Standing
Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs is authorized to submit legislation related to
the report to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.
