8	from including questions about criminal history on its employment application forms.			
9	The amendment provides an exception to that prohibition when, due to the nature and			
10	requirements of the position, a person who has a criminal history record may be			
11	disqualified from eligibility, such as for a law enforcement officer, corrections officer,			
12	child protective and adult protective services caseworker or child development services			
13	worker. The amendment applies to state employment positions in the legislative,
