4 5 6 7 8 9 10	4-A. Costs of plans for middle school career and technical education exploration programs. Beginning in fiscal year 2018-19, and in each subsequent fiscal year, costs Costs approved pursuant to chapter 313 attributable to establishing and operating career and technical education exploration programs for middle school students. The commissioner may establish an allocation to school administrative units and career and technical education centers for plans under this subsection. The plans must be implemented within the school administrative unit or career and technical education center; and
11 12 13 14	SUMMARY This bill allows the expansion of the allocation of money to career and technical education centers for career and technical education exploration programs for middle school students.
