2	Sec. 1. 34-B MRSA c. 3, sub-c. 3, art. 3 is enacted to read:

4	INTENTIONAL PEER SUPPORT PROGRAMS		
5	§3631. Peer respite centers		
6 7	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.		
8 9	A. "Certified peer support specialist" means a peer who has successfully completed an intentional peer support training offered through the department.		
10 11	B. "Intentional peer support" means support offered by a certified peer suppor specialist through a community-based and evidence-based program.		
12 13	C. "Peer" means a person who has experience living with mental health crises, including trauma, and has experience being a consumer of the mental health system.		
14 15 16	D. "Peer respite center" or "center" means a residential living environment managed and staffed by peers that offers an intentional peer support program offered by a certified peer support specialist to persons with mental health needs.		
17 18 19 20	2. Establishment of peer respite centers required. The department shall establish through contracts 2 peer respite centers in the State for persons 18 years of age or older. The centers must provide 24-hour intentional peer support to persons in need of mental health services on a voluntary, short-term basis. The centers must be:		
21 22 23	A. In geographically diverse locations in the State;B. Located in areas of the State that have populations with a high utilization rate of crisis services, according to data maintained by the department; and		
24	C. Operated by:		
25	(1) A peer-run organization; or		
26 27	(2) An organization with a board of directors or an advisory group in which 51% or more of its members are peers.		
28 29 30 31 32 33	3. Rulemaking. The department shall prescribe by rule the requirements for its contracts with peer respite centers, including required data reporting or other reports to allow the department to monitor and evaluate the services provided by the centers. The department shall adopt other rules as necessary to implement this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
