An Act To Protect Animals in Unattended Vehicles

2	Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §4019, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:
3	2-A. Removal by other than authorized person. After making reasonable efforts
4	to locate a motor vehicle's owner, a person other than an authorized person as defined in
5	subsection 1 may enter a motor vehicle to remove an animal if the person:
6	A. Notifies law enforcement or calls the E-9-1-1 system before entering the motor
7	<u>vehicle;</u>
8	B. Determines that the motor vehicle is locked and there is no other reasonable
9	means for exit and uses no more force than is reasonably necessary to enter the motor
10	vehicle and remove the animal;
11	C. Has a good faith belief, based upon known circumstances, that entry into the
12	motor vehicle is necessary because the animal's safety, health or well-being appears
13	to be in immediate danger from heat, cold or lack of adequate ventilation and the
14	conditions could reasonably be expected to cause extreme suffering or death; and
15	D. Remains with the animal in a safe location in reasonable proximity to the motor
16	vehicle until an authorized person as defined in subsection 1 arrives.
17	Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §4019, sub-§3, as amended by PL 2011, c. 288, §1, is further

19	3. Immunity. An authorized person who removes an animal from a motor vehicle
20	pursuant to subsection 1 or a person who removes an animal from a motor vehicle
21	pursuant to subsection 2-A is immune from criminal or civil liability that might otherwise
22	result from the removal.

24	This bill allows a person who is not a law enforcement officer, humane agent, animal
25	control officer, firefighter, first responder or security guard to enter a vehicle and remove
26	an animal if the animal's safety, health or well-being appears to be in immediate danger.
27	The bill provides that a person who removes an animal from a vehicle under these
28	conditions is immune from criminal or civil liability
