1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §3204, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 452, Pt. I, §55 and affected by Pt. X, §2, is amended to read:
4	2. Exceptions. This section does not apply to:
5	A. Common, contract and private carriers;
6	B. Taxicabs;
7	C. Airplanes;
8	D. Newspapers;
9	E. Radio and television stations;
10	F. Hotels, motels, rooming houses, tourist and trailer camps;
11	G. Restaurants;
12	H. Garages and motor vehicle service stations;
13	I. Retail monument dealers;
14	J. Automatic laundries;
15 16	K. Machines that vend anything of value, including, but not limited to, a product, money or service;
17 18	L. A satellite facility approved by the Superintendent of Financial Institutions under Title 9-B; or comparable facility approved by the appropriate federal authority;
19	M. Pharmacies;
20	N. Greenhouses;
21 22	O. Seasonal stands engaged in sale of farm produce, dairy products, seafood or Christmas trees;
23	P. Public utilities;
24 25	Q. Industries normally kept in continuous operation, including, but not limited to, electric generation plants, pulp and paper plants and textile plants;
26	R. Processing plants handling agricultural produce or products of the sea;
27	S. Ship chandleries;
28	T. Marinas;
29 30	U. Establishments primarily selling boats, boating equipment, sporting equipment, souvenirs and novelties;
31	V. Motion picture theaters;
32	W. Public dancing;
33	X. Sports and athletic events;
34	Y. Bowling alleys;
35	Z. Displaying or exploding fireworks, under Title 8, chapter 9-A;
36	AA. Musical concerts;

1	BB. Religious, educational, scientific or philosophical lectures;
2	CC. Scenic, historic, recreational and amusement facilities;
3	DD. Real estate brokers and real estate sales representatives;
4	EE. Mobile home brokers and mobile home sales representatives;
5	FF. Stores in which no more than 5 persons, including the proprietor, are employed in
6	the usual and regular conduct of business;
7 8	GG. Stores that have no more than 5,000 square feet of interior customer selling space, excluding back room storage, office and processing space; and
9	HH. Stores with more than 5,000 square feet of interior customer selling space that
10 11	engage in retail sales and that do not require, as a condition of employment, that their employees work on Sundays. If an employer decreases the average weekly work hours
11	of an employee who has declined to work on Sundays, it is prima facie evidence that
13	the employer has required Sunday work as a condition of employment in violation of
14	this section, unless the employer and employee agreed that the employee would work
15	on Sundays when the employee was initially hired. In no event, however, may any
16 17	Except as provided in paragraph II, a store having more than 5,000 square feet of interior customer selling space may not be open on Easter Day, Thanksgiving Day and
18	or Christmas Day-; and
19	II. Grocery stores with no more than 10,000 square feet of interior customer selling
20	space may be open on Easter Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day if the
21 22	requirements of section 3210 are met. For purposes of this paragraph, "grocery store" has the same meaning as in Title 22, section 2491, subsection 7-B.
23	This subsection does not exempt the businesses or facilities specified in sections 3205 and,
24	3207 and 3210 from closing in any municipality until the requirements of those sections
25	have been met.
26	Sec. 2. 17 MRSA §3210 is enacted to read:
27	§3210. Local option; grocery stores
28	A municipality may by ordinance allow grocery stores with no more than 10,000 square
29	feet of interior customer selling space to be open on Easter Day, Thanksgiving Day and
30 31	<u>Christmas Day. For purposes of this section, "grocery store" has the same meaning as in Title 22, section 2491, subsection 7-B.</u>

32	SUMMARY
33	This bill allows a municipality by ordinance to allow grocery stores with no more than
34	10,000 square feet of interior customer selling space to be open on Easter Day,
35	Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.
