## An Act To Lower the Youth Hunting Age

- 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §11108-C, sub-§3, as amended by PL 2019, c. 639, §6, is further
  amended to read:

4 3. Junior hunter supervisor required. A hunter person who is at least 10 years of 5 age and under 16 years of age may not hunt unless that person holds a junior hunting license 6 and is in the presence of and under the effective control of a junior hunter supervisor, except that a person who is at least 14 years of age and under 16 years of age may hunt without 7 8 being in the presence of or under the effective control of a junior hunter supervisor if that 9 person has completed a hunter safety course established under section 10108 specific to the method of hunting authorized by the license. A hunter person who is under 10 years of age 10 may not hunt unless that person holds a junior hunting license and is in the presence of and 11 under the effective control of a junior hunter supervisor who remains at all times within 20 12 13 feet of that hunter.

SUMMARY
 This bill allows a person who holds a junior hunting license, has completed a relevant
 hunter safety course and is at least 14 years of age to hunt without being accompanied by
 or under the direct supervision of a junior hunter supervisor.
