An Act to Prohibit the Use of Toy Cannon Fireworks Devices That Exceed 150 Decibels Without Permission from Affected Property Owners

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 8 MRSA §223-A, sub-§8-A is enacted to read:
3 4 5 6 7 8	8-A. Toy cannons. The use of a toy cannon is governed by this subsection in addition to the other requirements of this chapter. A person may not use a toy cannon in a location where there is any affected property owner, unless the person has the written permission of each affected property owner. As used in this subsection, "toy cannon" means a type of consumer fireworks in the shape of a cannon that, when discharged, emits a sound of more than 150 decibels, as measured
9 10 11	at the cannon. As used in this subsection, "affected property owner" means any person owning or renting a residence located on property that is within 1,000 feet of the location of the use of the toy cannon.
12 13	A person who violates this subsection commits a civil violation for which a fine of \$100 may be adjudged for any one offense.
14	SUMMARY
15 16	This bill requires a person using a toy cannon fireworks device, which when discharged emits a sound of more than 150 decibels, to get permission from affected property owners.
