RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Protect Personal Reproductive Autonomy

Resolved:** Two thirds of each branch of the 2 Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be 3 proposed:

4 **Constitution**, **Art. I**, **§26** is enacted to read:

5 <u>Section 26. Personal reproductive autonomy.</u> Every person has a right to 6 personal reproductive autonomy, which is central to dignity and the liberty to determine 7 one's own life course. The State may not deny or infringe on the right to personal 8 reproductive autonomy unless the denial or infringement is justified by a compelling state 9 interest and is accomplished using the means that least denies or infringes on the right.

10 **Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date.** 11 **Resolved:** That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their 12 respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding 13 a statewide election, at a statewide election held in the month of November following the 14 passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this 15 resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to declare that every
person has a right to personal reproductive autonomy?"

18 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square 19 below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and declared 20 21 in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the 22 23 returns. If it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of 24 25 the Constitution of Maine on the date of the proclamation.

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State
 shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of
 this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.
