0 1	1. Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
2 3 4	A. "Trauma-informed training" means training to recognize the presence of trauma symptoms and acknowledge the role that trauma can play in people's lives, including by engaging with individuals with histories of trauma.
5 6 7 8 9	2. Training program and embedded clinical social workers. The Department of Public Safety shall develop and implement a program to provide law enforcement officers with trauma-informed training. The department shall work with municipalities to develop and implement a program to employ clinical social workers to work embedded within municipal police departments.
0 1 2	3. Rules. The Commissioner of Public Safety may adopt rules to implement this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

4 5 6 7	This bill requires the Department of Public Safety to develop and implement a program to provide law enforcement officers with trauma-informed training and requires the department to work with municipalities to develop and implement a program to employ clinical social workers to work embedded within municipal police departments.
