1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §1751-A is enacted to read:
3	§1751-A. Electronic inspection program
4 5 6 7 8 9	The Chief of the State Police may make available, but may not require the use of, an electronic inspection program for the purpose of inspections performed under this chapter. For the purposes of this section, "electronic inspection program" means a program, designated by the Chief of the State Police by rule, that uses electronically generated data as part of an inspection and permits the creation and exchange of an electronic record for maintaining inspection information.
10 11	1. Implementation. The Chief of the State Police may contract with a private entity to implement an electronic inspection program.
12 13	<b>2. Phased approach.</b> The Chief of the State Police may develop by rule an approach to phase in the implementation of an electronic inspection program throughout the State.
14 15 16 17	3. Fee. The Chief of the State Police may designate by rule a fee that an inspection station must pay to the State for each inspection performed using an electronic inspection program. A fee required under this subsection may not be more than the cost to the State of using the electronic inspection program to perform an inspection.
18 19 20	<b>4. Rules.</b> The Chief of the State Police shall adopt rules to implement this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5. chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

22 23 24	This bill allows the Chief of the State Police to make available, but does not authorize the chief to require the use of, an electronic inspection program for the purpose of performing motor vehicle inspections.
