## An Act To Prohibit Individuals under 21 Years of Age from Being in Certain Establishments Licensed To Sell Alcohol

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 28-A MRSA §1065, sub-§4, as amended by PL 2003, c. 493, §12 and affected by §14, is further amended to read:
- **4. Minors not allowed on premises.** Minors are not permitted to remain on the premises except when:
  - A. The minor is accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or custodian as defined in Title 22, section 4002; or
  - B. The licensee does not permit consumption of liquor on the premises for a specific period of time or event.

## **SUMMARY**

This bill repeals the exceptions that allow minors to be on the premises of establishments licensed to sell alcohol as a Class A lounge and clarifies that minors are not allowed on the premises.
