Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §4015 is enacted to read:
§4015. Minimum wage for educational technicians and other school support staff
Beginning October 1, 2023 and every January 1st thereafter, a school administrative unit shall establish a minimum wage for educational technicians as defined in section 13001-A, subsection 8 that is equal to 133% of the minimum wage established in Title 26, section 664, subsection 1 and a minimum wage for other school support staff that is equal to 125% of the minimum wage established in Title 26, section 664, subsection 1.
SUMMARY
This bill provides that beginning October 1, 2023 and every January 1st thereafter, a school administrative unit must establish a minimum wage for educational technicians that is equal to 133% of the minimum wage established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section 664, subsection 1 and a minimum wage for other school support staff that is equal to 125% of the minimum wage established in Title 26, section 664, subsection 1.
