An Act To Allow Candidate Name Tags on Election Day

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §682, sub-§3, ¶D is enacted to read:
3	D. This subsection does not prohibit a candidate who stands outside the polls within
4	250 feet of the entrance to the voting place or the building in which the registrar's
5	office is located from wearing a name tag. The name tag must be white with black
6	lettering and include the candidate's name and the office for which the candidate is
7	running and may not be larger than 1 1/2 inches by 3 inches.
8	SUMMARY
9	This bill allows a candidate who stands outside the polls, within the designated area,
10	to wear a name tag.
