BE	IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
Se	ection 1. COVID-19 EMERGENCY COMMUNITY RELIEF GRANTS.
<u>:</u>	Subdivision 1. Establishment. The COVID-19 emergency community relief grants
prog	gram is established to award grants to community action agencies to make grants to
indi	viduals experiencing financial hardship as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak.
<u>:</u>	Subd. 2. Statewide grants. To the extent practicable, the commissioner of human services
shal	ll award grants so that an approximately equal dollar amount of grants are made to
<u>indi</u>	viduals in the metropolitan area and the nonmetropolitan area. Priority shall also be
give	en to community action agencies serving culturally specific populations either directly
or tl	hrough grants to other organizations who will make the grants to individuals.
<u> </u>	Subd. 3. Eligibility for individuals. In order to qualify for a grant, an individual must
be a	able to demonstrate financial hardship as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak. Financial
haro	dship includes but is not limited to showing that an individual:
<u> </u>	(1) is not eligible to receive unemployment benefits. Such individuals may include but
are	not limited to individuals in the country on an H1B or other work visa or who are
self	-employed;
<u>(</u>	(2) will not receive unemployment benefits at a rate that is commensurate with their
earr	nings. Such individuals may include but are not limited to tipped employees whose
earr	nings do not accurately reflect income:

.8	Subd. 4. Maximum grant award. The amount of assistance shall depend on the
.9 <u>ind</u>	ividual needs of the household, taking into consideration other resources that an individual
.10 <u>or l</u>	nousehold is eligible to receive. The maximum amount of assistance may not exceed
11 <b>\$1</b> ,	500 per individual.
12	Subd. 5. Use of grant funds. Grant funds received by an individual under this section
13 <u>ma</u>	y be used for food, emergency household items, rent support, utility bills, and other
4 <u>sim</u>	nilar expenses. Assistance for rent support and utility bills must be made directly to the
5 <u>ren</u>	tal property owner or utility company.
6	Subd. 6. Reporting on use of funds. Community action agencies receiving grants under
7 <u>this</u>	s section must submit quarterly reports to the commissioner of human services on a form
8 <u>dev</u>	veloped by the commissioner with information about the purposes for which the funds
9 <u>we</u>	re awarded to individuals in accordance with this section. The first quarterly report must
0 <u>be</u>	submitted no later than August 1, 2020, and the last quarterly report must be submitted
1 <u>no</u>	later than August 1, 2021.

24	\$100,000,000 is appropriated in fiscal year 2021 from the general fund to the
25 <u>cor</u>	nmissioner of human services for the COVID-19 emergency community relief grants
6 <u>unc</u>	der section 1. Of this amount, up to ten percent may be used for the administrative costs
7 <u>of t</u>	he agency and the community grantees. This is a onetime appropriation and is available
