1.6	Subdivision 1. Required information. (a) When dispensing prescription opioids, a
1.7	dispenser must provide to a patient, the patient's agent, or the patient's caregiver, clear and
1.8	conspicuous written information, in plain language, about:
1.9	(1) the addictive nature of opioids and the risks of opioid abuse; and
1.10	(2) safe disposal of unused prescription opioids. This information must be consistent
