3.11 or federal government that is more than
3.12 \$150,000 but not more than \$300,000.

3.13 (c) \$100,000 of this appropriation is for
3.14 technical assistance grants to local and
3.15 regional housing trust funds. A housing trust
3.16 fund may apply for a technical assistance grant
3.17 at the time and in the manner and form
3.18 required by the agency. The agency shall make
3.19 grants on a first-come, first-served basis. A
3.20 technical assistance grant must not exceed
3.21 \$5,000.

3.22 (d) A grantee must use grant funds within
3.23 eight years of receipt for purposes (1)
3.24 authorized under Minnesota Statutes, section
3.25 462C.16, subdivision 3, and (2) benefiting
3.26 households with incomes at or below 115
3.27 percent of the state median income. A grantee
3.28 must return any grant funds not used for these
3.29 purposes within eight years of receipt to the
3.30 commissioner of the Housing Finance Agency
3.31 for deposit into the housing development fund.

3.33 This act is effective July 1, 2019.
