	Subd. 2. Certification. By February 1, 2022, and annually thereafter, a city must certify
1	to the state auditor the number of peace officers provided in the budget the city adopted for
,	2020 and the number of peace officers provided in the city's most recently adopted budget.
,	The state auditor must determine the form and manner of the certification. By March 15,
′	2022, and annually thereafter, the state auditor must certify to the commissioner (1) a list
(of cities that certified under this subdivision, and (2) a list of identified cities.
