1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 152.22, subdivision 14, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 14. Qualifying medical condition. "Qualifying medical condition" means a
1.8	diagnosis of any of the following conditions:
1.9	(1) cancer, if the underlying condition or treatment produces one or more of the following:
1.10	(i) severe or chronic pain;
1.11	(ii) nausea or severe vomiting; or
1.12	(iii) cachexia or severe wasting;
1.13	(2) glaucoma;
1.14	(3) human immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome;
1.15	(4) Tourette's syndrome;
1.16	(5) amyotrophic lateral sclerosis;
1.17	(6) seizures, including those characteristic of epilepsy;
1.18	(7) severe and persistent muscle spasms, including those characteristic of multiple
1.19	sclerosis;
1.20	(8) inflammatory bowel disease, including Crohn's disease;

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- 2.1 (9) terminal illness, with a probable life expectancy of under one year, if the illness or its treatment produces one or more of the following:
- 2.3 (i) severe or chronic pain;
