1.9	(b) "Medical literature" means articles from major peer reviewed medical journals
1.10	that have recognized the drug or combination of drugs' safety and effectiveness for
1.11	treatment of the indication for which it has been prescribed. Each article shall meet the
1.12	uniform requirements for manuscripts submitted to biomedical journals established by
1.13	the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors or be published in a journal
