1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 119B.03, subdivision 4, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 4. Funding priority. (a) First priority for child care assistance under the basic
1.8	sliding fee program must be given to eligible non-MFIP families who do not have a high
1.9	school diploma or commissioner of education-selected high school equivalency certification
1.10	or who need remedial and basic skill courses in order to pursue employment or to pursue
1.11	education leading to employment and who need child care assistance to participate in the
1.12	education program. This includes student parents as defined under section 119B.011,
1.13	subdivision 19b. Within this priority, the following subpriorities must be used:
1.14	(1) child care needs of minor parents;
1.15	(2) child care needs of parents under 21 years of age; and
1.16	(3) child care needs of other parents within the priority group described in this paragraph.
1.17	(b) Second priority must be given to parents who have completed their MFIP or DWP
1.18	transition year, or parents who are no longer receiving or eligible for diversionary work
1.19	program supports families in which at least one parent is a veteran, as defined under section

2.19	remaining available funds allocated according to the following formula:
2.20	(a) One-fourth of the funds shall be allocated in proportion to each county's total
2.21	expenditures for the basic sliding fee child care program reported during the most recent
2.22	fiscal year completed at the time of the notice of allocation.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective January 1, 2022. The 2022 calendar year shall be a phase-in year for the allocation formula in this section using phase-in provisions determined by the commissioner of human services.
