1.6	Subd. 5. Grant stipends. The grant stipend shall be based on a sharing of responsibility
1.7	for covering the recognized cost of attendance by the applicant, the applicant's family, and
1.8	the government. The amount of a financial stipend must not exceed a grant applicant's
1.9	recognized cost of attendance, as defined in subdivision 6, after deducting the following:
1.10	(1) the assigned student responsibility of at least 50 47 percent of the cost of attending
1.11	the institution of the applicant's choosing;
1.12	(2) the assigned family responsibility as defined in section 136A.101; and
1.13	(3) the amount of a federal Pell grant award for which the grant applicant is eligible.
