1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 256B.0625, subdivision 17a, is amended to
1.7	read:
1.8	Subd. 17a. Payment for ambulance services. (a) Medical assistance covers ambulance
1.9	services. Providers shall bill ambulance services according to Medicare criteria.
1.10	Nonemergency ambulance services shall not be paid as emergencies. Effective for services
1.11	rendered on or after July 1, 2001, medical assistance payments for ambulance services shall
1.12	be paid at the Medicare reimbursement rate or at the medical assistance payment rate in
1.13	effect on July 1, 2000, whichever is greater.
1.14	(b) Effective for services provided on or after July 1, 2016, through December 31, 2019,
1.15	medical assistance payment rates for ambulance services identified in this paragraph are
1.16	increased by five percent. Capitation payments made to managed care plans and county-based
1.17	purchasing plans for ambulance services provided on or after January 1, 2017, shall be
1.18	increased to reflect this rate increase. The increased rate described in this paragraph applies
1.19	to ambulance service providers whose base of operations as defined in section 144E.10 is
1.20	located:
1.21	(1) outside the metropolitan counties listed in section 473.121, subdivision 4, and outside
1.22	the cities of Duluth, Mankato, Moorhead, St. Cloud, and Rochester; or
1.23	(2) within a municipality with a population of less than 1,000.

(c) Effective for services provided on or after January 1, 2020, medical assistance payment
