1.5	Section 1. PRIVATE SALE OF TAX-FORFEITED LANDS BORDERING PUBLIC
1.6	WATER; HENNEPIN COUNTY.
1.7	(a) Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, sections 92.45 and 282.018, subdivision 1, and
1.8	the public sale provisions of Minnesota Statutes, chapter 282, Hennepin County may sell
1.9	by private sale the tax-forfeited lands bordering public water that are described in paragraph
1.10	(c) under the remaining provisions of Minnesota Statutes, chapter 282.
1.11	(b) The conveyances must be in a form approved by the attorney general. The attorney
1.12	general may make changes to the land descriptions to correct errors and ensure accuracy.
1.13	The sale is subject to a reservation of conservation easements or conditions that the
1.14	commissioner of natural resources may prescribe. The commissioner must provide any
1.15	easement requirements or conditions to Hennepin County within 120 days of the effective
