1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 243.166, is amended by adding a subdivision

1.9	Subd. 4d. Schools; notice of status. (a) An offender who is enrolled in a school in the
1.10	state at the time a court imposes a registration requirement under this section and an offender
1.11	who seeks to enroll in a school located in the state shall disclose to:
1.12	(1) the school's principal or chief administrator the person's status as a registered predatory
1.13	offender under this section; and
1.14	(2) the law enforcement authority with primary jurisdiction in the community where the
1.15	school is located that the person is required to register as a predatory offender and will be
1.16	attending the school.
1.17	An offender seeking to enroll in a school located in the state must provide the notice required
1.18	under this paragraph prior to enrollment.
1.19	(b) A law enforcement authority who receives notice under paragraph (a) or who knows
1.20	that a person required to register under this section will attend a school shall notify the
1.21	principal or chief administrator of the school and deliver a fact sheet to the school's principal
1.22	or chief administrator containing the following information:
